



And in the skeleton of trees


Against the darkening blue of dusk's sky.








- > Pagans realize interconnections with nature
- > Readings of nature are the oldest divination
- > Symbols map patterns, past, present, & future

Self-Dedication

Initiation

- Requires more than one person or a group
- Focuses deity & energy on you



Self-Dedication

- > Dedicate yourself to follow a path & your gods
- > Typically taken after studying for a year & a day
- Fives you the ability to reach out & draw in the energies on your own
